<u>Cut Flowers Section</u>: (d.c) different colours (d.v) different varieties

- 1 Rose means 1 Flower (no buds)
- 1 Stem means any number of flowers or buds
- 1 Full blown Rose, stamens must be visible
- 1 Decorative Rose, a large hybrid tea, or floribunda type rose, not necessarily exhibition rose, side buds are allowed eg. Just Joey.

An exhibition rose must have a pointed bud.


